5. All admissions are made on the spot. No other intimation will be given about the dates of admission except the information given in the table above.
6. CBSC and ICSC students should indicate marks secured out of 1000 by including the marks of two languages and three relevant optional subjects. Diploma holders should also compute their marks to 1000.
7. All those who submit their applications for any of the above courses and are eligible should attend the counseling sessions mentioned above at their own expense. Those who fail to appear on the date(s) and time(s) mentioned shall not be considered for admission under any circumstances.
8. Incomplete applications will not be entertained under any circumstances. Incorrect entries will be viewed seriously.

9. Unless **Receipt A** is produced no admission or enquiry will be permitted. No change of combination / preference / second language will be allowed once a candidate has got a seat in any particular course.
10. **Return of Transfer Certificate.** The T.C. submitted at the time of admission will be returned to the candidate only if he / she cancels his / her admission on or before the last day of admissions. On cancellation of admission after the last date of admissions, the T.C. of Nizam College will be issued. Request for cancellations should be made under the applicant's own signature.

A Word from the Principal

Welcome!

It is my privilege as the Principal and also as an alumnus of Nizam College to welcome the 121st batch of students to this prestigious college. Established in 1887 by the amalgamation of Hyderabad School and the Madarsa-i-Aliya, the Nizam College is one of the oldest and prestigious institutions of higher education in South India. It was affiliated to the University of Madras for 60 years since its inception, and was made a Constituent College of Osmania University on 19th February 1947.

The college was granted Autonomous Status by the UGC in 1988 – 89 for Undergraduate Courses and it continues to enjoy this status. The college offers both undergraduate and postgraduate courses in the Faculties of Arts, Social Sciences, Sciences and Commerce. Several of our students are also pursuing doctoral and postdoctoral programmes. The college has been recognized as College with Potential for Excellence and is accredited by NAAC.

In keeping with its tradition of Excellence, the college has all possible programmes and activities to actualize the potential for excellence and enhance performance in all spheres. Under the CPE scheme the college has strengthened the academic and physical infrastructure, and has set up a Multimedia Lab, Central Analytical Instrumentation Centre, Chem. Informatics Lab, Business Lab, Computer Aided Language Learning Lab, and upgraded Placement & Guidance Cell and Psychological Testing & Counseling Centre. All these have helped our students to gain practical experience within the college premises and prepare themselves for placements in some of the top institutions.

Our College this year introduced many new innovative add-on and skill oriented courses. We also started MBA course and a 5 year integrated Post Graduate Programme in Economics and Chemistry. Our placement centre organizes on-campus recruitments involving industries and MNC's like Wipro, Infosys, Cognizant, Satyam, Nipuna, GE, etc. totaling to more than 25 reputed companies. To help the students equip themselves for better career prospects the Career Guidance & Placement Center regularly trains students in programmes like Career Orientation and Placement Training (COPT) and Soft Skills.

Interschool seminars organized and presented, not only by the members of the faculty but also by the students, is a unique feature of our college. Our new teacher recruits attended an orientation programme organized by the Osmania University. Research activities by the staff and students have enabled the college to receive substantial grants for further research. Many teachers presented papers in national and international conferences and published many books and articles. Departments of Chemistry and Physics are known internationally for their contribution to research in the fields of Bio-inorganics and Bio-Physics.

Foreign students constitute 10% of the total number of students. They are from countries like: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nigeria, Maldives, Mauritius, Somalia, Ethiopia, Oman, Iran, Saudi Arabia, Yemen, and Eritria. Their enthusiastic participation in extra and co-curricular activities creates an ambience of a global community and camaraderie. This is entirely due to the International popularity and acknowledgement of the academic excellence of the college. With regard to the number of foreign students, Nizam College stands first in Andhra Pradesh.

The construction of a new hostel building, much-needed student welfare project, has been initiated at a cost of Rs.2.50 crores. This will help the students immensely. Our College students enjoy a number of facilities for several extra and co-curricular activities.

As part of the value – added activities we have NSS, NCC, Women’s Cell, and basic infrastructure for the differently abled. All these help the institution to establish meaningful linkages between Campus & Community, Colleges & Villages, and Knowledge & Action. Our NSS and NCC teams organize social awareness programmes and are now planning to adopt a village. Under the basic infrastructure for the differently abled, scribes are provided, Braille Texts are supplied, and Psychological Counseling is made available to them.

Having this rich tradition of excellence in all fields of learning, the college decided to celebrate the completion of 120 years. To commemorate the beginning of these celebrations, three day cultural and academic programmes were organised. Under this banner various departments set up stalls showcasing their talents. A stall was also set up by the visually impaired, presenting methods and methodology of their learning. The department of Theatre Arts performed plays and group dances. Both the staff and students participated in various cultural activities. During the inaugural, the presence of some distinguished alumni added the glory of the past to the grandeur of the present. Hon’ble Speaker Sri. K.R. Suresh Reddy and the Hon’ble minister for labour Sri. G. Vinod was our chief guest and the guest of honour respectively. The Alumni Association formally set up in the college with the Principal as the ex- officio member has received a very good response. A souvenir of reminiscences ‘KALIDOSCOPE’ was published to mark this event.

These and many other activities crowd the calendar of the college with one single goal for all that we do—strive for excellence. We hope that the coming years will take the college to newer heights of grandeur in the field of higher education and our new batch of students will carry forward the torch of excellence.

Fee Concessions:

- a. The fee mentioned above is also applicable to all the SC/ST students. The SC / ST students whose parents' income is below Rs.38, 220/- per annum have to pay a nominal fee of Rs.270/- at the time of admission to secure a seat. However, if any SC / ST student leaves the Institution before the sanction and release of the Scholarship by the social welfare department, Govt. of AP, he / she shall pay the entire fee mentioned above. He/she shall pay in addition the self-financing fee if he/she is admitted to such course.
- b. B.C. students whose parent's / guardian's income is less than Rs.33, 500/- per annum are eligible to apply for scholarship. In case of conventional B.Sc. / B. Com. / B.A. Courses, fees paid by B.C. students will be reimbursed, as and when the amount is sanctioned by the B C welfare Department, Govt of AP.
- c. However in case of all self financing courses all the students (excluding SC & ST as the amount sanctioned by the welfare department will be adjusted) have to pay the self financing fee at the time of the admission. In case of the students who pay the self-financing fee it will be refunded after the sanction of this fee by the social welfare department.

Eligibility Criteria:

- a. A student seeking admission to B.Sc. / B.Com. / B.A. courses should have passed the Intermediate Examination conducted by the Board of Intermediate Examination, A.P. or any other examinations recognized as equivalent. For admission into B.Sc. the student should have studied the relevant subjects at the +2 level while **all students who have passed intermediate are eligible to apply for B.Com. & B.A. courses irrespective of the subjects studied at the Intermediate level.**
- b. A student seeking admission to B.Sc. I Year course should have passed and obtained at least 40% marks in the optional subjects at the qualifying examination. For S.C. & S.T. category pass marks is the eligibility criterion.
- c. Compartmental and Instant Examination Candidates: Candidates passing the qualifying examination compartmentally or through instant examination are treated on par and the latter are also eligible to apply but their cases will be considered provided:
 - i. Seats are available after accommodating 'one attempt candidates' who would have submitted their application within the stipulated time.
 - ii. They submit the memorandum of marks and other necessary documents before the prescribed date.
- d. No Candidate is permitted to pursue more than one course at a time in the same institution or different institutions simultaneously.
- e. All students pursuing degree courses in Nizam College are eligible for the certificate and diploma cases introduced under UGC add-on scheme.

Admission Procedure:

- a. Admissions are made strictly on the basis of merit. When a candidate's name, marks, etc are announced he / she has to produce the **receipt of the application form** to obtain entry into the admission room.
- b. **After verification of certificates and counseling** candidates are required to **fill in** the 'Admission Form', **pay the fees** and submit the form along with the **Original Certificate of T C** and two sets of photocopies (duly attested) of the following certificates and collect the **Admission Slip**
 - I. Transfer Certificate from the Institution where the candidate has studied Intermediate or its equivalent.
 - II. Pass Certificate / Provisional Certificate of the qualifying examination.
 - III. Memorandum of Marks.
 - IV. Study Certificate / Bonafide Certificate of School and Intermediate.
 - V. Proof of Local / Non-local status according to the rules in force. (See Annexure – I & II).
 - VI. B.C./ S.C./ S.T. Certificates issued on or after 1-4-08 by a competent authority.
 - VII. Income certificate / Income declaration wherever necessary issued on or after 1.4.2008 by a competent authority.
 - VIII. Migration Certificate / No Objection Certificate in case of candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from a board other than the Board of Intermediate, Government of Andhra Pradesh.
 - IX. Relevant certificates in respect of candidates selected for admission against Sports / NCC / Extra-Curricular activities / Children of Ex-Servicemen and Armed Personnel / Physically Handicapped quota, etc.
 - X. Six recent stamp size photographs of the candidates.

(Before the candidates come for spot admission, it is advisable to check the availability of all the above certificates along with the required amount of fees)

- c. A candidate who secures a seat but fails to avail it due to non-payment of fees or non-submission of required certificates **ON THE SPOT** shall have no claim to admission subsequently.
- d. Mere payment of fees in cash will not entitle a candidate to a seat. The **submission of admission form** and relevant certificates and the collection of the **duly signed admission slip are compulsory**.
- e. **On detection of any violation of the rules in force, the College reserves the right to cancel the admission at any stage.**

4. About a few Special Courses

a. Computer Sciences: Started in 1989, the Course consists of languages such as Pascal, COBOL, FORTRAN, C and packages like dBase, Lotus, WordStar. The hardware course is in "Computer Organization and Architecture." Students take up project work in various companies / research laboratories in the course of study. They use operating systems viz. DOS, UNIX and latest software such as Visual Basic, Visual C etc. based on Windows for their projects. The Computer laboratory has about 30 nodes (Pentium 200 + 486) connected to a central server (Pentium – III, 266 MHZ).

The laboratory is air-conditioned and power supply is through UPS (4.5 KVA). Upgrading the computers is taken up regularly to higher speeds and greater storage space. The laboratory is also equipped with 132 column dot matrix printers (CQ 1050+) and a scanner. Our college was the first Constituent College in Osmania University to set up INTERNET facility.

b. e-Commerce: Information Technology now being a part of everyday life, its study has become necessary. Learning of e-Commerce is the new way which helps in conducting, managing and executing business transactions and services through electronic media and telecommunication networks. The e-Commerce course equips students with basic tools for understanding business systems & processes, ensures that students are made to learn development of an e-Commerce solution from the scratch and prepares professionals to develop and implement e-Commerce solutions in various ways.

c. Marketing Communication and Media Studies: A holistic and futuristic approach to media, man and society—basic and specialized. Significance features of the course are to emphasize an inter-disciplinary approach Advertising, Sales Promotion, Sales Management and Public Relations in addition to Psychological and Social Sciences. The course also includes Computer related skills – Multi Media, Internet and Web Designing and Communication Media Skills. On-job training at the end of 2nd and 4th semesters in reputed Advertising and Sales Promotion Units are a part of the Course. The objectives of the Course are to equip students for self-employment as entrepreneurs and seek employment in challenging business areas such as Advertising, Sales Promotion, Sales Management, Public Relations and to impart knowledge and develop skills among undergraduates in the field of Marketing, Communications in different Medias with the help of professional and experienced people in the field of marketing, communication and computers.

d. English ML: This course has been reintroduced to cater to the needs of the academic and corporate sectors. English being the global language is no longer confined to the western ethos. Literature is bound to be impacted by the socio cultural economic political and technological developments. All these aspects are integral to the understanding of human nature. Study of literature equips an individual with tools of understanding human resources and discourse. The present course in English Literature has literatures of the world written in English. Students with a good foundation in such a course can find placements in segments like content writing, training English language skills, teaching, civil services, public relations, management, electronic and print media both in local and global markets. e. Certificate Course in Cheminformatics: University Grants Commission, New Delhi has permitted a few colleges to introduce career oriented courses to the under graduate students and we are proud to announce that Nizam College is one of them. Chemistry, the science of materials and their transformations, exhibits a broad diversity of information, which by now encompasses an enormous body of knowledge about chemical structure, properties and reactions. Comparable efforts are needed to master the flood of information and accumulated knowledge in chemistry today. This is made possible with the advent of the computers and internet. In its sequel at the turn of century, the work of the forerunners at the intersection of chemistry and computer science eventually received recognition in its entirety in the form of a new inter disciplinary science: **CHEMINFORMATICS**. Even in the west this course has seen light only after 2002. **This course is exclusively offered to 30 chemistry students of Nizam College.** This course comprises units on Chemical Information (Extracting, Mining & Visualization), Chemical Structure Representation and Standards, Open Access: Molecular Databases in the Internet, "In Silico" Library Design and Analysis, Structure Activity/Property/Toxicity Relationships and Drug Design and Discovery

f. Certificate Course in Drug Designing and Synthetic Techniques Program: The field of organic chemistry and drug design is in a state of swift development and is at present undergoing major restructuring. These developments have provided new challenges and opportunities for drug research in general and for drug designing in particular. Consequently, most industrial laboratories have build up new technologies in order to meet these demands. Often the recruiting agencies and industrial groups complain about this fact. There is no program in this direction to address and rectify this shortcoming among UG students so the department has started drug designing and synthetic techniques as an add on course to give additional skills to the existing B. Sc students.

g. Certificate Course in Chemical Analysis and Quality Assurance: This course is aimed at students pursuing under - graduate program (B.Sc / B.Sc Tech). The Chemical Analysis based on Conventional and Instrumental methods of Analysis is a science, useful in all fields. In view of its wide applications in diversified fields, it is planned to introduce as a certificate course for B.Sc Students. To maintain good laboratory data, learning “Quality Assurance” program is mandatory. Hence along with methods of Chemical Analysis, the topic ‘Quality Assurance’ is added as part of the syllabus for the course “Chemical Analysis and Quality Assurance”. Students undergo training in various classical methods of analysis as well as in instrumental methods of analysis (Colorimetry, Spectrophotometry, Potentiometry, pH metry, Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometry, Flame Photometry, Fluorimetry etc.).

With their background in the instrumental and conventional methods, the students will be given an opportunity to work with various chemical and drug industries around Hyderabad like Natco labs, Dr.Reddy labs, Divies labs, Vimta labs, CCCM, DMRL etc. These students can also join the Clinical analysis labs, environmental monitoring organizations and other industries like polymer industry, leather industry, dye manufacturing industries, cement industries etc.

h. Computer Assisted Language Learning: From this academic year the Department of English, as an innovative plan, would conduct a 15-week add-on course for both PG & UG students under Computer Assisted Language Learning scheme. The course includes voice training. The course is part of the CALL, financed under the CPE scheme. Besides improving communication skills CALL help students to pursue careers in teaching, performing arts, media and BPOs etc. The courseware for Behaviorist CALL and Communicative CALL is based on the concept of *computer as tutor*.

i. Remedial Course in English: One of the UGC recommended courses conducted by the Department of English every year is a 32-hour (16 two-hour classes per day) or 4-week Remedial Course in Communication Skills in English for students coming from regional language background. The course trains students in basic communicative skills such as reading, writing and speaking in addition to improving the communicative competence of the students in terms of vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation. It is open for students of all faculties.

Reservations

Admissions will be finalized subject to the reservation rules in force as specified below:

1. Local and Non-local Candidates:

Admission to 85% of the available seats in every course shall be reserved in favour of the Local Candidates in relation to the Local area in respect of Osmania University and the remaining 15% of seats are left unreserved for which both Local and Non-Local Candidates can compete.

(For details see Annexure I & for Proforma of certificate, see Annexure-II).

2. B.C., S.C. & S.T. Candidates:

Of the total number of seats available in each course, the reservations will be as follows: BCA-7%, BCB-10%, BCC-1%, BCD-7% (Total 25%); SC 15%; ST-6%.

3. **Women:** There shall be 33.3% reservation for women candidates as per the rules of the Government of Andhra Pradesh.

4. **Other Reserved Categories:** This covers NCC, Games & Sports, Extra-curricular Activities, Children of Ex-Servicemen and Armed Personnel and Physically Challenged. Of the total number of seats available in each course, the following is the schedule of reservation of seats in these categories: NCC-2%, Games & Sports- 2%, Extra-curricular Activities-1%, Children of Ex-Servicemen & Armed Personnel-1% and Physically Challenged -3%.

5. **B.Com.:** 60% of the available seats in B.Com. Courses are reserved for students who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce as a subject. The remaining 40% seats are open to students from commerce and non-commerce streams.

6. **B.A.:** 50% of the available seats in B.A. course are reserved for candidates of Arts stream and the remaining 50% are open to students from Arts and Non-Arts streams. Arts stream refers to candidates who have studied at least one Social Science / Arts subject at the qualifying examination.

Attendance Requirement, Examination and Promotion Rules

The College has a Semester System of instruction and examination which operates as follows:

The college follows a **15 week Semester System**. An almanac for the entire year is prepared at the commencement of odd semesters. Every month respective departments submit attendance to the Academic Coordinator. The Academic Coordinator computes this data and displays it by the 10th of every month. The respective departments also display the same. Any anomaly has to be corrected during that month. The students are cautioned about the shortage of attendance. The College Administration will not entertain any dispute at the end of the semester for any discrepancy of the previous months. **At the end of the each semester, the cumulative percentage of attendance is calculated and the student is issued a hall ticket based on the stipulated percentage of attendance of 75%.**

In case the students fail to obtain 75% attendance, waiver to an extent of 10% on MEDICAL GROUNDS is permitted based on the submission of a medical certificate issued by a competent authority. Candidates who fail to obtain the required percentage of attendance will be detained and will not be promoted to the next semester.

1. 75% attendance both in theory and practical courses (wherever applicable) is mandatory for candidates to be eligible to appear for the semester examination. All students who represent the College in Inter-Collegiate, Inter-varsity, National and International Competitions are eligible for attendance exemption of 8 weeks per year, that is, 4 weeks per semester or the period of the competition whichever is less.
2. Examinations for I, III and V semesters are held in November each year after 15 weeks of instruction. There are no detentions at the end of I, III and V Semesters.
3. Examinations for II, IV & VI semesters are held in April each year after 15 weeks of instruction. **There is detention system at the end of II and IV semesters.**
4. (a) At the end of II semester candidates who do not have more than 50% backlog papers of the I and II Semesters together will be promoted to III Semester.

 (b) At the end of IV Semester candidates who do not have more than 25% backlog papers in all, of I to IV semesters together, will be promoted to V Semester. All backlog papers of I, II, III & IV semesters have to be cleared in the respective semesters.

 (c) **There are no backlog examinations of odd semesters with even semester of that corresponding year. Except the V semester backlog which can be cleared along with the even semester examinations and the VI semester can be cleared along with odd semester exams.**
5. **A candidate's promotion to subsequent semesters is subject to regular attendance (75%), payment of fee (including exam fee), and good conduct.**
6. Any student failing to clear dues such as College fees, Hostel dues, Special fees, Self-financing fees, etc., shall not be eligible for promotion. Even if a student is eligible for any kind of scholarship, he / she has to clear all the above dues by the time he / she appears for the examinations of that academic year.

7. Every student is required to complete his/her course of study within 6 years from the date of admission, after which he / she will not be permitted for any more examinations. The date of admission of students admitted on transfer from other institutions will be notionally treated on par with his / her batch mates.

8. **Award of division:** For the award of division in Part-I / Part-II, it will be necessary for a student to pass all the papers by the end of IV / VI Semesters.

9. **Improvement and Backlogs:**

(a) A student who wishes to improve his / her result is entitled to repeat the examination in any paper provided he / she has cleared all the papers relating to the relevant Semester. No student with a backlog is permitted to appear for improvement examination for the relevant semester. Improvement is permitted only in the next corresponding semester examination except in the case of IV semester backlog which can be cleared in November of the same year instead of waiting till April of the next year.

(b) Whenever there is a change in syllabus / model paper, the student will be given only one chance in the next corresponding semester examination to clear the backlog of that paper under the old syllabus / model paper. Candidates are required to prepare for the examination with new syllabus / model paper subsequently.

10. **Medium of Examinations:** Students admitted to a particular medium of instruction have to appear for the examinations in the same medium. If for any reason they write the examination in another medium, their scripts will not be evaluated.

11. Without **75% of attendance in lectures and practicals** students will not be entitled to

- (a) Appear for the examination
- (b) Claim any scholarship.
- (c) Be promoted to the next semester.

12. Students who discontinue their study at this College but wish to seek admission again to I Semester with / without a change of faculty or combination, **need to apply again** and will be considered for admission only on merit (based on their intermediate marks) along with other fresh applicants.

Other Academic Programmes

To equip the students with additional knowledge and skills along with their regular course of study, the College runs a variety of short term UGC funded courses. All students who join the UG and PG courses of Nizam College are advised to make the best of their years of study in the college by taking up as many of these courses as they can.

NAAC Accreditation: Based on curricular aspects, innovative learning, teaching and evaluation methods, research, consultancy, extension programmes, infrastructure and learning resources, student support and progression, organization and management procedures, and healthy practices Nizam College was accredited by NAAC.

Being a NAAC accredited Institution for Higher Learning; Nizam College has constituted IQAC, Internal Quality Assurance Cell as a post accreditation quality sustenance activity. The objectives, functions, strategies and benefits of IQAC are as follows:

b. Constituent Autonomous Status: Being a constituent college of Osmania University that is an Off Campus college of Osmania University, Nizam College is directly governed by the Osmania University administration. The departments and the faculty work under the guidance of the heads and chairpersons in the campus colleges. Being a University college scope for academic research and innovative programmes is high. The number of teachers with doctoral degrees and post doctoral research is a sure sign of academic excellence.

The academic autonomy enables Nizam College to review and revise curriculum according to the needs of the stakeholders. The innovative programmes coupled with highly qualified faculty have enabled Nizam College to achieve better standards of teaching, learning and research and also to seek the status of a College with potential for Excellence.

c. CPE - College with Potential for Excellence Status: The CPE status was conferred upon by UGC under the X Plan which adopted an effective strategy to improve teaching, learning and research in the colleges, based on the premise that higher education is one of the ways of producing talented, skilled and value oriented human resources. The colleges selected for CPE status were evaluated on 70 various parameters. Nizam College stood out with flying colours and was sanctioned one crore for further development programmes. Under this scheme the following plans were further strengthened.

- Modernization of Office, Exam - Library and Department
- Books Maps etc.
- Fully Equipped Seminar Hall
- Central Analytical Instrumentation Centre & Chem. Informatics Lab
- Multimedia Internet Lab
- Business Lab
- Placement Centre
- Psychological Counseling and Testing Centre
- Skill Oriented Courses – A Language Lab was established to assist CALL Programme

d. Infrastructure: The College is located in the heart of the city of Hyderabad in a sprawling 25-acre campus. There are numerous buildings housing classrooms, laboratories, computer labs, library and administrative offices. The vast area helps in creating conducive atmosphere for a holistic development of the learners. Equipped with a Seminar Hall, Language Lab, Play Grounds, a Boxing Hall, a Canteen, Library and parking space the college has a congenial setting for Learning.

e. Mentoring: A mentoring scheme is underway in order to make the students feel a sense of belonging as they seek guidance in academic and non-academic matters from members of the faculty.

f. Remedial Teaching for Weak Students: Sufficient care is taken by way of remedial teaching for academically weak students. The timetable for U.G. students is drafted in such a way that sufficient leisure hours are earmarked for students to take special assistance. The Department of English has been specifically organizing remedial coaching for Telugu Medium students, foreign students and students of other vernacular media at the beginning of the semester. Similarly Departments of Sanskrit and Hindi are also involved in these activities. In some instances special classes are arranged during holidays. The Departmental seminar libraries are kept open to P.G. students during the working hours besides the general library. Most of the teachers are available in the department to assist students and interact with them in the learning process.

g. Evaluation of teaching by students: The College has introduced student evaluation of each course/ teacher. A questionnaire is given to the student at the end of the academic year and the feedback is collated and recorded. Based on these observations relevant discussions are held with teacher/s concerned for effective results and timely action.

h. In-Service training for teachers: Teachers of the College are regularly deputed for training in special subjects. Attendance at the Orientation Course and Refresher Courses is a must for junior teachers and most of them have participated in these. Teachers have attended special training programmes for teaching vocational subjects. Some of these are as follows:

- Under the faculty-training programme some of the Staff members of Botany Department were deputed to various Agricultural Universities to get first-hand information on the latest trends in seed technology.
- The teachers belonging to the Department of Psychology and Economics, involved in teaching the paper on “Sales Promotion” have undergone training at UGC sponsored programmes.
- Teachers belonging to the Commerce Department have been deputed to undergo training programmes at UGC sponsored workshops in the field of Foreign Trade.
- Teachers were deputed to participate in the UGC sponsored question bank workshop in Chemistry, Economics, Botany, History, Political Science, Sociology, Physics and Geography.

i. Career Guidance and Placement Center: Under the CPE scheme the Career Guidance and Placement Center was established in December 2004. The Center has been organising Campus Placement programmes, well-known companies such as Cognizant, Infosys, Wipro, Reddy’s Lab, Asian Paints, MRF, IBM, Satyam, Nipuna, GENPACT, Kotak Mahindra, Apollo Health Street, Accenture, ADP, Kanbay, Convergys, etc. The Center has also been organizing regular lectures on Career Opportunities available to UG and PG students. Besides providing placement opportunities to students of the College, the Center helps the students to equip themselves with skills and training to suit the job market.

j. ELTC: English Language Teaching Centre offers self financing courses in language skills. It conducts special courses for teachers & housewives, spoken English courses for all the age groups, IELTS for the students who want to study abroad, advanced course for the students who have completed their basic spoken English course and accent neutralization course for trainers.

k. NCC Activities: Nizam College has a company of over 100 cadets and all the activities are under the control of a part-time NCC Officer. During the academic years of 1993-94 and 1994-95, NCC Day was celebrated and the function was presided over by the Principal. Participation of NCC cadets of Nizam College at the Annual Republic Day Parade in New Delhi is a regular feature. In the recent Golden Jubilee Republic Day Parade the N.C.C contingent of Andhra Pradesh which won the Prime Ministers Medal had three of our NCC cadets as participants. The percentage passing out with B & C Certificates from among the cadets of the College is over 75%. Besides these, the cadets actively participate in various camps like Army Attachment Camp, CACT Camp, National Mountaineering Camp, National Integration Camp, etc. Their involvement in NCC and the laurels won by them help the cadets in securing seats for higher education under the NCC quota. A sense of discipline is built up in students who enroll as NCC cadets.

l. Games & Sports: Numerous games and sports activities are organized by Department of Physical Education. The vast campus of the College is equipped with grounds for Cricket, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Shuttle, Hockey, Kabbadi, Foot Ball, Korf Ball and rooms for indoor games like Table Tennis, Chess, etc. This is the only college in twin cities to have such facility other than the O.U. Campus. A Multi-Station gymnasium with an investment of Rs.1 Lakh was installed in the College recently. The Department conducts various events both at the College and Inter-college level. Our students have participated in the Inter-Collegiate Tournaments in some of the above events in addition to swimming and athletics. The performance of the teams is commendable and our teams have been winners in Swimming, Cricket, Table Tennis and Athletics. The College students have participated in many games at Junior Nationals, Inter-University and Junior State level. One of the students is a Gold Medalist at Junior National and State level in Boxing. Junior State level representations have been made in athletics also. Nizam College has regained the overall championship in inter collegiate tournaments of Osmania University having on Gold medal in football & Judo. Nizam College stood first in HCA two day league matches.

m. Extra Curricular Activities & Extension Works: Students constitute the core of an educational institution and the overall development of their personality should be the prime motive of educational institutions. Having realised this basic need, Nizam College has been providing various opportunities to its students for a total and meaningful personality development. The students' affairs are guided by a Students Advisors appointed by the Principal. One of the major activities is the annual cultural meet, viz., "*EXPRESSIONS.*" It provides an opportunity to our students to organise various literary and cultural events and to interact with hundreds of students from all the other colleges in the city. Students are sponsored by the College to participate in various cultural and literary events at the Inter-College and Inter-University level both within and outside the State. Our students have started various Clubs like the *Discussion Forum* where they hold debates on current issues, the *Ray-Orion Club* for cultural and literary activities, the *Green Club* to create environmental awareness, the *Science Club* for keeping up with the innovations in the field of science and so on. A *Women's Cell* constituted for gender sensitization enables students to participate in awareness programmes. Girl students are given necessary support for organizing seminars or discussions on the role and problems of women in the developmental process. Educational tours and programmes are encouraged. Our students participated in a National Cultural Fest in Mangalore. **MBA students....**

n. NSS Activities: The enrolment in the National Service Scheme is quite high and over 150 candidates are on rolls. NSS activities are held under the direction of the NSS Programme Officer who is appointed by the NSS Coordinator, Osmania University, on the Principal's recommendation. NSS volunteers have been actively participating in several programmes like the Green Run, Tree Plantation programmes organised by the MCH, National Integration Communal Harmony Seminar, *Sadbhavana* Run conducted by the Directorate of Youth Services, Govt. of A.P. They also organised a very successful blood donation camp in the College in February 2007 and 2008.

o. Multimedia Lab: Under the CPE Scheme the College has established a Multimedia Lab during the academic year 2004-2005. This lab enables the teachers to prepare and present lessons in multimedia format. Self Financing Short term courses are planned for teachers and students. This enhances the quality of teaching-learning and benefits numerous students. Workshops are held for teachers to train them in the preparation of lessons in multimedia format.

p. Language Lab: A language lab with software for language learning skills is available. This lab enables Computer Aided Language Learning and Computer Based Testing.

q. Psychological Testing and Counseling Cell: Offers not only personal counseling but also psychological testing for school and college students related to intelligence, personality, family dynamics, early identification of MR, LD and other behavioral problems

r. Interaction with Parents: The College always tries to maintain an interactive relationship with the parents / guardians of the students. We, therefore, request the parents/guardians of our students to devote some time to check the progress of their children / wards. **We also request the parents to furnish their current contact details and feel free to contact us as often as necessary.** An atmosphere where our students can express themselves freely and overcome inhibitions is thus created. Formal meets with parents to facilitate a tripartite interaction is a regular feature.

s. Alumni Association: The Alumni Association of the college meets once a year. Some activities taken up by the alumni are: interaction with the present students, extension lectures in their respective fields of expertise, cultural activities and aid to improve infrastructural facilities. t. Academic Awards: An alumnus Sri M.A. Krishnamurthy has instituted a prize for the students scoring highest marks in Mathematics at the undergraduate level. Awards for scoring highest marks in Sociology, Chemistry and English at the UG / PG levels are being instituted by the Principal and other interested members of the faculty. Others are also encouraged to institute similar academic awards / medals for the encouragement of students to bring out their potential for excellence. A gold Medal in Economics has been instituted to be awarded to the topper in BA (English Medium, EPP). An Annual Endowment Lecture in Economics has been initiated.

u. Library & Study Center: The College has a well equipped library with about 1, 07,577 books and 78 journals which include text and reference books and research journals. The library functions on all working days from 10.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. The Library is headed by a Librarian and assisted by 13 personnel. Books on all the subjects of study in the college as well as books of general interest are available here. Besides the main library, some of the post-graduate and undergraduate departments have their own Seminar Libraries. The main library is open on holidays during examination time to facilitate students prepare for the exams. A separate “Study Centre” caters to the needs of students belonging to various colleges in the twin cities and also to those appearing externally for University Examinations. The Centre functions from 12.00 noon to 6.00 p.m. on all days of the week except Thursdays. The Centre has more than 4000 text and reference books which include books from all disciplines. Digitalization of the library is in progress.

v. Hostel: The College has a hostel at a furlong’s distance and caters to about 250 boarders. It is managed by the General Warden, a Mess Warden and Vice Principal Hostels. On the recommendations of the Principal, Osmania University appoints the Hostel Wardens (General & Mess) and Vice Principal Hostels. The University also has hostels in the O.U campus for the benefit of PG students studying M.A & M.Com. **Hostel admission is not available for the candidates seeking admission for the academic year 2008 – 09 as the old hostel building has been demolished for reconstruction of a new hostel building. No accommodation will be provided till the new building becomes functional. Due to limited accommodation hostel admission is not guaranteed to all the applicants.** All the hostel dues have to be cleared before the issue of hall tickets. The results will be withheld if a student fails to comply with this.

w. Health Center: The College has a Health Center with a full-time doctor looking after the needs of both staff and students. The Health Center is well equipped for first aid and outpatient

consultancy. The Center also serves to the needs of hostel boarders. It also helps in organizing health camps on the campus.

x. Grievance Redressal Cell: Senior Professors suggest and provide solutions to the aggrieved. Drop Boxes are provided in all the blocks of the college. They also consider issues like, facilities in college, staff and student related matters, theft and discipline related matters.

y. Sports: The physical education department of Nizam College is one of the departments that has made its mark in the field of sports. Our students have always maintained a high standard of sportsmanship and a drive to participate in various tournaments and bring laurels to our college. Keeping up the tradition of producing national and international players as our alumnus record shows our students consistently strive to excel themselves

z. Add-on & Skill Oriented Courses: UGC has recognized the need for value-added courses at the Degree level. With this objective in view, the College has designed certificate and diploma courses approved and sanctioned by the UGC. These courses are offered without affecting the regular classes. ANNEXURE – I

Rules of Admission in Accordance with the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulations of Admission) Order, 1974 – With Amendments, 1975 & 1976

I. Admission to 85% of the available seats in every course of study profiled by Osmania University shall be reserved in favor of Local Area in respect of the Osmania University.

‘A’ Local Area:

The part of state comprising the districts of Adilabad, Hyderabad, (including the twin cities) Karimnagar, Khammam, Mahaboobnagar, Medak, Nalgonda, Nizamabad, Ranga Reddy and Warangal shall be regarded as the local area for the purpose of admission to the Osmania University and to any other educational institution (other than, State-wide University or State-wide Educational institution which is subject to the control of the State Government and is situated in that part). [Privately managed educational institutions (including private colleges) are not covered by the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh Educational institutions regulation of admission order, 1974].

‘B’ Local Candidate:

1. A candidate for admission to any course of study shall be regarded as a Local candidate in relation to local area.
 - i. If he/she studied in an educational Institution or educational Institutions in such local area for period of not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the Academic Year in which he / she appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination or
 - ii. Where, during, the whole or any part of the four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in any educational institution if he has not studied in any educational institution if he has resided in that local area or for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared.
2. A candidate for admission to any course of study who is not regarded as a local candidate under sub para (1) in relation to any local area.
 - a. If he/she studied in an educational institution in the State for a period of not less than seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination be regarded as a local candidate in relation to
 - i. Such local area where he has studied for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years, or
 - ii. Where the periods of his study in two or more local areas are, equal, such local area where he has studied last in such equal periods, or
 - b. If during the whole or any of the seven consecutive academic year in which he appeared, or as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in the educational institutions in any local area, but has resided in the state during the whole of the said period of seven years, be regarded as local candidate in relation to:

- i. Such local area where he has studied out of the said period of seven years, or
 - ii. Where the periods of his study in two or more local areas are equal such local area where he has studied last in such equal periods.
- II. The remaining 15% of the available seats left unreserved in terms of the presidential order shall be made available to:
 - a) All candidates who have studied in a recognized educational institution or institutions in the State for a period or not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which they appeared, as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination, or where during the whole or any part of such four consecutive academic years, not studied in any educational institution if they have resided in the State for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination.
 - b) Candidates who have resided in the state for a total period of ten years excluding periods of study outside the state, or either of whose parents have resided in the State for a total period of ten years excluding the periods of employment outside the State.
 - c) Candidates who are children of parents who are in the employment of this State or Central Government / Public sector corporation Local Bodies, Universities and other similar quasi / public institutions within the State.
 - d) Candidates who are spouses of those in the employment of this State or Central Government, Public Sector Corporations, Local Bodies, Universities and Educational Institutions recognized by the Government, a University or other competent authority and similar other competent authority and similar other quasi-Government Institution within the State.
 - e) Candidate who are employees in the State, Central Government Undertaking, Public Sector Corporations, Local Bodies Universities and other similar quasi-public institutions within the State.
