Quest for Excellence: In the classroom, in the arena of research and in co-curricular, extracurricular activities, the college is on a constant quest for excellence as can be seen from the activities calendar. Recently a distinguished alumnus Sri Shyam Benegal said he acquired excellence in his student days in Nizam College not only from his teachers but by peer interaction. So from this year we are introducing a unique Peer Exchange Programme (PEP) where any student who has exceptional knowledge, awareness, skills and competence can share it with his/her peers.

Understanding the Concept: The College has understood, disseminated and enhanced the concept of excellence through the 120 years of its existence and continues to do so. As a celebration of this, excellence in numerous academic and other fields marked the year-long 120-year celebration from Feb 2008 to December 2008.

Action-oriented: To actualize the concept of excellence, Nizam College has numerous concrete projects— post-doctoral research of faculty, students engaged in projects in the industry, students who excel in the world of sports, numerous seminars, workshops for all levels of the college from Class IV employees, through non-teaching and teaching staff to students.

Learner-centric Approach: Learning is a lifelong process for the Nizamian. Inside the classroom, the teaching methodology is learner-centered. The dept of English has prepared a new text book for General English effective from 2009-10 which illustrates this. Every other dept is also constantly foregrounding the learner; and teachers are now settled in their role as facilitators. Student activities abound in the curricular calendar.

Innovation for Change: Our goal of excellence is a progressing target which expands with time. The list of special academic programmes will spell out the varieties of innovation at the institutional level. But the excellence of our teaching faculty rests on their ability to implement innovations in the classroom. This is periodically evaluated in seminars such as “Innovative Classroom Strategies” held in May 2009.

Trainning to Build competencies: Students find the college a vibrant training ground for all-round development. Their academic training is measured by continuous evaluations and the results speak eloquently for their competency in their subjects of study. They are also given training in soft skills, personality development, computers, getting placements and any other field they need. Remedial training programmes are being conducted by all the major departments of the college.

The Principal's Message

Welcome to the New Batch of Students! (PHOTO OF PRINCIPAL)

As the new Principal of Nizam College, I feel privileged to welcome the new batch of students seeking admission to this prestigious college this year. Established in 1887 by the amalgamation of Hyderabad School and the Madarsa-i-Aliya, Nizam College is one of the oldest and most esteemed institutions of higher education in South India. It was affiliated to the University of Madras for 60 years after its inception, and was made a Constituent College of Osmania University on 19th February 1947.

I am happy to inform you that recently the college has been granted extension of Autonomy for six years from 2009 to 2015. This is **one year more** than the usual period of extension, that is, 5 years. The college was first granted Autonomous Status for Undergraduate Courses by the UGC in 1988-89 and has already completed 20 successful years of autonomy. The UGC Autonomy Review Expert Committee which visited the College in October 2009 was extremely impressed and commended the College. To add to the innovations under Autonomy, UG students taking admission from this academic year will have compulsory project work in the final year.

The college offers both undergraduate and postgraduate courses in the Faculties of Arts, Social Sciences, Sciences and Commerce in addition to professional courses such as MBA MCA, M.Sc.(IS) and BCA. Several of our students are also pursuing doctoral and postdoctoral research. Under the X Plan Nizam College was a College with Potential for Excellence and we expect the same during the XI Plan period. The College is accredited by NAAC and we are seeking Re-accreditation this year.

Nizam College does not live on the laurels of the past alone. Our glorious history is enriched by the long list of our current achievements. Under the CPE scheme the college has strengthened its academic and physical infrastructure, and has set up state-of-the-art facilities such as a Multimedia Lab, Central Analytical Instrumentation Centre, Chem. Informatics Lab, Business Lab, Computer Aided Language Learning Lab, and upgraded the Career Guidance and Placement Centre as well as the Psychological Testing & Counseling Centre. All these have helped our students to gain practical experience within the college premises and prepare themselves for placements in some of the top institutions. Our Placement Centre organises on-campus recruitments involving industries and MNC's like Wipro, Infosys, Cognizant, Satyam, Nipuna, GE, etc. totaling to more than 25 to 50 reputed companies. About 100-150 students get selected in Campus recruitments. To help the students equip themselves for better career prospects the Career Guidance & Placement Center regularly trains students in programmes like Career Orientation and Placement Training (COPT) and Soft Skills.

Our college has in the recent past introduced many new innovative add-on and skill-oriented courses. The members of the college faculty as well as some of our students participate actively in academic seminars in different universities and colleges and present papers at national and international conferences. A number of seminars are also organised by them in the college. Many teachers publish books and articles regularly. Research activities by the faculty and students are also commendable and have enabled the college to receive substantial grants for further research and development. The Departments of Chemistry and Physics are known internationally for their contribution to research in the fields of Bio-inorganics, Molecular Modelling and Drug Designing, Spectroscopy and Bio-Physics. The DBT has given star status to the departments of Genetics, Biochemistry and Microbiology.

Nizam College is foremost in the preference of students from various Asian and African countries. Foreign students constitute 25% of the total strength of the college. They are from countries like: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nigeria, Maldives, Mauritius, Sudan, Somalia, Ethiopia, Oman, Djibouti, Iran, Saudi Arabia, Yemen, and Eritrea. Their enthusiastic participation in academics, extra- and co-curricular activities creates an ambience of a global community with rich cultural exchange.

The infrastructure of the college is much improved. Construction of the second floor of the Hostel Building is near completion. It will be ready by July 2010. the foundation stone for additional Chemistry Block will be laid in April 2010.

As part of the value-added activities we have NSS, NCC, Women's Cell, and basic infrastructure for the differently-abled. All these help the institution to establish meaningful linkages between Campus & Community, Colleges & Villages, and Knowledge & Action. Our NSS and NCC teams organise social awareness programmes and are now planning to adopt a village. Under the basic infrastructure for the differently-abled, scribes are provided, Braille texts are supplied, and Psychological Counseling is made available to them. The Alumni Association has been active in the recent past and hopes to take up multi-faceted developmental activities in the coming years. An innovative programme "Earn while you Learn" has been introduced for students of the psychology department who help in the laboratories. In the coming academic year this programme will be introduced in other departments also.

Therefore, in Nizam College we always strive for excellence. The responsibility of keeping up this excellence and enhancing it rests on your shoulders. I hope every new student will take this task seriously so that the coming years will take the college to newer heights.

The fees mentioned above are also applicable to all the SC/ST/BC/ BC(E) students except those whose parent's/guardian's income is less than Rs.1,00,000/- per annum who have to pay a nominal fee of Rs.360/- at the time of admission to secure a seat.

These students are instructed to apply the scholarship, reimbursement of tuition fee by the social welfare/Tribal Welfare/Backward Classes welfare department through "ONLINE" which has started from 11-8-2009 as mentioned in the website. The scholarship forms can be downloaded from the website www.sbms.ap.gov.in and fill up the relevant columns through "ONLINE" submission only. The printed copy of "online" submitted scholarship form along with encloses the following certificates and submits the same at the scholarship section of this College without fail. Otherwise they have to pay Tuition fee to the college before commencement of First semester examination as well as if their scholarships are not sanctioned by the government. It is compulsory to apply the scholarship through "ONLINE" particularly those who were claimed the exemption for payment of Tuition fees at the time of admission.

NOTE: Students are advised to keep extra Xerox copies of all the original certificates before submitting as the original certificates will not issued to students until the scholarships are sanctioned.

Eligibility Criteria:

- a. A student seeking admission to B.Sc./B.Com./B.A. courses should have passed the Intermediate Examination conducted by the Board of Intermediate Examination, A.P. or any other examinations recognised as equivalent thereto. For admission into B.Sc. the student should have studied the relevant subjects at +2 level (for Physical Sciences—MPC; for Biological Sciences—BPC) while **all students who have passed intermediate are eligible to apply for B.Com. & B.A. courses irrespective of the subjects studied at the Intermediate level.**
- b. A student seeking admission to B.Sc. I Year course should have passed the qualifying examination with at least 40% marks in the optional subjects. S.C. & S.T. categories are eligible if they secure pass marks in the optional subjects.
- c. **Compartmental and Instant Examination Candidates:** Candidates passing the qualifying examination compartmentally or through instant examination are also eligible to apply but their cases will be considered subject to the following:
 - i. Seats are available after accommodating candidates who have passed in one attempt and they have submitted their application before the last date—5th June 2010.
 - ii. They submit the memorandum of marks and other necessary documents before the last date—5th June 2010.
- d. No candidate is permitted to pursue more than one course at a time in the same institution or different institutions.

- e. All students pursuing degree courses in Nizam College are eligible to enroll for the certificate and diploma courses introduced under UGC (COP) add-on scheme by the college.

Admission Procedure:

- I. Admissions are made strictly on the basis of merit. On the date and time of the spot admission, when a candidate's name, marks, etc. are announced he/she has to produce the **receipt of the application form** to obtain entry into the admission room.

- II. **After verification of certificates and counseling**, candidates are required to **fill in the 'Admission Form', pay the fees** and submit the form along with the **Original Transfer Certificate** and **two sets of photocopies** (duly attested) of the other certificates listed below and collect the **Admission Slip**.
 - a. Transfer Certificate from the Institution where the candidate has studied Intermediate or its equivalent.
 - b. Pass Certificate/Provisional Certificate of the qualifying examination.
 - c. Memorandum of Marks.
 - d. Study Certificate/Bonafide Certificate of School and Intermediate.
 - e. Proof of Local/Non-local status according to the rules in force. (See Annexure I & II).
 - f. B.C./S.C./S.T. Certificates issued on or after 1-4-2010 by a competent authority. Income certificate/Income declaration wherever necessary should also be issued on or after 1.4.2010 by a competent authority.
 - g. Migration Certificate/No Objection Certificate in case of candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from a board other than the Board of Intermediate, Government of Andhra Pradesh.
 - h. Relevant certificates in respect of candidates selected for admission against Sports/NCC/Extra-Curricular activities/Children of Ex-Servicemen and Armed Personnel /Physically Handicapped quota, etc.
 - i. Six recent stamp size photographs of the candidates.

(Before the candidates come for spot admission, it is advisable to check the availability of all the above certificates along with the required amount for paying the full fee for the course chosen)

- a. A candidate who secures a seat but fails to avail this opportunity due to non-payment of fees or non-submission of required certificates **ON THE SPOT** shall have no claim to admission subsequently.
- b. Mere payment of fees in cash will not entitle a candidate to a seat. The **submission of the admission form** and relevant certificates and the collection of the **duly signed admission slip are compulsory**.
- c. **On detection of any violation of the rules in force, the college reserves the right to cancel the admission at any stage.**
- d. **No readmission is made after completion of 4 weeks from the commencement of the date of instruction (22nd July 2010)**

Reservations Applicable to Admissions

Admissions will be finalized subject to the reservation rules in force as specified below:

1. Local and Non-local Candidates: Admission to 85% of the available seats in every course are reserved for Local Candidates where Local area is defined with respect to the location of 9 Telangana districts and the remaining 15% seats are unreserved for which both Local and Non-Local Candidates can compete. (*For details see Annexure I & for Proforma of certificate, see Annexure-II*).

2. B.C., S.C. & S.T. Candidates: Of the total number of seats available in each course, the following are reserved in the proportion mentioned: BC (A) - 7%; BC (B) - 10%; BC (C) - 1%; BC (D) - 7%; BC (E) - 4% [subject to decision of the Court] (Total 29%); SC - 15%; ST - 6%. (Total 50%) [These do not include NCC, Physically handicapped, sports, ex-servicemen and extracurricular activities reservations]

3. Women: 33.3% of the seats in each course are reserved for women candidates as per the rules of the Government of Andhra Pradesh.

4. Other Reserved Categories: This covers NCC, Games & Sports, Extra-curricular Activities, Children of Ex-Servicemen and Armed Personnel and Physically Challenged. Of the total number of seats available in each course, the following is the extent of reservation for these categories: NCC - 2%, Games & Sports - 2%, Extra-curricular Activities - 1%, Children of Ex-Servicemen & Armed Personnel - 1% and Physically Challenged - 3%.

5. B.Com.: 60% of the available seats in the B.Com. Course (both Regular and e-Commerce) are reserved for students who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce as a subject. The remaining 40% seats are open to the students from both commerce and non-commerce streams.

6. B.A.: 50% of the available seats in the B.A. Course (all combinations) are reserved for candidates who have completed the qualifying examination with humanities and social sciences. The remaining 50% are open to students from humanities and social sciences as well as all other streams.

7. NIQ Quota: 5% Supernumerary seats in each course are available to the candidates belonging to outside Andhra Pradesh under National Integration Quota (NIQ)

GENDER SENSITIZATION

The Protection against Sexual Harassment of Women Bill passed in 2005

Sexual harassment at the work place can occur in a variety of circumstances, including, but not limited to the following:

- The victim as well as the harasser may be a woman or a man. The victim does not have to be of the opposite sex.
- The harasser can be the victim's supervisor an agent of the employer, a supervisor in another area, a coworker, or a non-employee (eg. a customer or supplier).
- The victim does not have to be the person harassed, but could be anyone affected by the offensive conduct.

Unlawful sexual harassment may occur without economic injury or discharge (firing) of the victim.

The harasser's conduct must be unwelcome. Any one can be harassed sexually. Sexual harassment cannot happen only to women employees, even men employees are sexually harassed. If men can sexually harass women, women are also subjecting men to sexual harassment.

Employees of the same sex can harass each other, if the harassment is of heterosexual nature. Example, if an employee constantly bombards another employee to explicit photos, explicit sexual jokes, and that makes him uncomfortable, and if it persists after his continued objection, it amounts to sexual harassment.

Attendance Requirement, Examination and Promotion Rules

The college has a Semester System which operates as follows:

The college follows a **15 week Semester System**. An almanac for the entire year is prepared at the commencement of I, III and V semesters. Every month respective departments submit attendance to the Academic Coordinator. The Academic Coordinator computes this data and displays it by the 10th of every month. The respective departments also display the same. Any anomaly has to be corrected during that month. The students are cautioned about the shortage of attendance. The College Administration will not entertain any dispute at the end of the semester about discrepancy in attendance of previous months. **At the end of the each semester, the cumulative percentage of attendance is calculated and the student is issued a hall-ticket for the ensuing examination only if he / she has 75% in all subjects.**

In case the students fail to obtain 75% attendance, waiver to an extent of 10% on MEDICAL GROUNDS is permitted based on the submission of a medical certificate issued by a competent authority. Candidates who fail to obtain the required percentage of attendance will be detained and will not be promoted to the next semester.

PLEASE NOTE:

1. 75% attendance both in theory and practical courses (wherever applicable) is mandatory for candidates to be eligible to appear for the semester examination. All students who represent the college in Inter-collegiate, Inter-varsity, National and International competitions are eligible for attendance exemption of 8 weeks per year; that is, 4 weeks per semester or the period of the competition whichever is less.
2. Examinations for I, III and V semesters are held in November each year after 15 weeks of instruction. There are no detentions at the end of I, III and V Semesters.
3. Examinations for II, IV & VI semesters are held in March-April each year after 15 weeks of instruction. **There is detention system at the end of II and IV semesters.**
4. **Registration for Examination:** All students undergoing regular courses of study have to register for every semester exam by paying the requisite exam fee, filling the examination form & obtaining the hall ticket before appearing for the said exam.
5. (a) At the end of II semester candidates who do not have more than 50% backlog papers of the I and II Semesters together will be promoted to III Semester.

(b) At the end of IV Semester candidates who do not have more than 25% backlog papers in all, from I to IV semesters together, will be promoted to V Semester.

(c) **During the regular exams of I, III and V semesters, backlogs of these semesters as well as the VI semester will be conducted. At this time there will be no backlog exams for the II and IV semesters. During the regular II, IV and VI semester exams, backlogs exams of ALL semesters will be conducted.**

6. A candidate's promotion to subsequent semesters is subject to regular attendance (75%), payment of fee (including exam fee), and good conduct.

7. Any student failing to clear dues such as college fees, hostel dues, special fees, self-financing fees, etc., shall not be eligible for promotion. Even if a student is eligible for any kind of scholarship, he/she has to clear all the above dues by the time he/she appears for the examinations of that academic year.

8. Every student is required to complete his/her course of study within 6 years from the date of admission, after which he/she will not be permitted for any more examinations. The date of admission of students admitted on transfer from other institutions will be notionally treated on par with his/her batchmates.

9. Award of division: For the award of division in Part-I / Part-II, it will be necessary for a student to pass all the papers by the end of IV / VI Semesters.

First Division:	60% and above
Second Division:	Below 60% and not less than 48%
Third Division:	Below 48% and not less than 36%

10. Improvement and Backlogs:

(a) A student who wishes to improve his/her result is entitled to repeat the examination in any paper provided he / she has cleared all the papers (in ONE ATTEMPT only) relating to the relevant semester. No student with a backlog is permitted to appear for improvement examination for the relevant semester. Improvement is permitted only in the next semester examination

(b) Whenever there is a change in syllabus/model paper, the student will be given only one chance in the next corresponding semester examination to clear the backlog of that paper under the old syllabus/model paper. Candidates are required to prepare for the examination with new syllabus/model paper subsequently.

11. MEDIUM OF EXAMINATIONS: STUDENTS ADMITTED TO A PARTICULAR MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION HAVE TO APPEAR FOR THE EXAMINATIONS IN THE SAME MEDIUM. IF FOR ANY REASON THEY WRITE THE EXAMINATION IN ANOTHER MEDIUM, THEIR SCRIPTS WILL NOT BE EVALUATED.

12. Without **75% of attendance in lectures and practicals** students will not be entitled to

- (a) Appear for the examination
- (b) Claim any scholarship.
- (c) Be promoted to the next semester.

13. Students who discontinue their study at this College but wish to seek admission again to I Semester with/without a change of faculty or combination, need to apply again and will be considered for admission only on merit (based on their intermediate marks) along with other fresh applicants.

Special SUBJECTS

I. Computers: Computer Science was introduced as a subject in 1989. The UG Computer Science Course consists of languages such as Pascal, COBOL, FORTRAN, C and packages like dBase, Lotus, WordStar. The hardware course is in “Computer Organization and Architecture.” Students take up project work in various companies / research laboratories in the course of study. They use operating systems DOS, Windows 2000, Windows XP2, Windows 2003, Unix, Linux and latest software such as Visual studio 2005 (VB, C#, J#, VC++) Core Java, Advanced Java, J2EE, J2ME, J2SE etc., based on Windows for their projects. The Computer laboratories have about 400 nodes (Pentium 1.7 – 2.8 GHz) and (Pentium 4/DualCore) connected to a central server (Pentium IV – 3.6 GHz). The laboratories are air-conditioned and power supply is through 10 UPS (7.5 KAV). Upgrading the computers is taken up regularly to higher speeds and greater storage space. The laboratories are also equipped with 132 column dot matrix printers (CQ 1050+), HP LaserJet P1007 and scanners. Our college was the first Constituent College in Osmania University to set up INTERNET facility of 1mb now available with 80 systems in all departments. Recently an additional air conditioned computer laboratory has been setup with 150 HP computers with UGC development fund under the scheme of promotion and basic scientific research. During the year 2008-09 this fund was granted to the college by UGC. Most of the students selected during campus recruitments in the college are from the computer science stream. Our College has computer labs in the following departments: Zoology, Chemistry, Commerce, MBA, MCA, BCA, English Language Lab, Multimedia lab.

Computer labs have the following: Operating System DOS, Windows 2000, Windows 2003, Windows 2000 server, Windows 2003 Sequel, Windows XP2, Unix, Linux & languages. C, C++, Java, Core Java, J2EE, VB, (visual studio) J2ME, J2SE, etc.

The Computer laboratories have about 500 nodes’ (Intel Pentium(R)₄, CPU 3.2 GHz, 1 GB RAM), (Dual Core & Core 2 DUO Processes) and 15 UPS of 7.5 KV.

II. e-Commerce: Information Technology now being a part of everyday life, its study has become necessary. Learning of e-Commerce is the new way which helps in conducting, managing and executing business transactions and services through electronic media and telecommunication networks. The e-Commerce course equips students with basic tools for understanding business systems & processes, ensures that students are made to learn development of an e-Commerce solution from the scratch and prepares professionals to develop and implement e-Commerce solutions in various ways.

III Marketing Communication and Media Studies: The course offers a holistic and futuristic approach to media, man and society – basic and specialized, significant features of the course are to emphasis an inter disciplinary approach to advertising, Marketing Communication, Sales Promotion, Sales Management, Entrepreneurship Development, Personal Selling, Public Relations in Addition to Psychological, English Literature, Social Sciences. The course also includes Computer related skills as a part of practical skills – Multimedia i.e. Adobe Photoshop, Adobe premiere pro, Macro Media Flash, Web designing and Communication media Skills.

On job training at the end o 2nd semester at Advertising Agency, at the end of 4th semester, the students are supposed to go to any organization and work under sales manager and at the end of 5th semester the students are supposed to do a multimedia live project.

The objective of the course are to equip students for self-employment as entrepreneurs and seek employment in challenging business areas such as Advertising, Sales promotion, Sales Management, public relation and to impart knowledge and develop skills among undergraduates in the field of Marketing, Communications in different medias with the help of Professional and Experienced people in the field of Marketing, Communication and Computers.

The department of Psychology and Marketing have started an “EARN WHILE YOU LEARN SCHEME”, during the academic year 2009-2010 by giving a job to our own student.

IV. English Literature: This course has been reintroduced to cater to the needs of the academic and corporate sectors. English as a global language is no longer confined to the western ethos. Literature is impacted by the socio-cultural, economic, political and technological developments. All these aspects are integral to the understanding of human nature. Study of literature equips an individual with tools of understanding human resources and discourse. The present course in English Literature has literatures of the world written in English. Students with a good foundation in such a course can find placements in segments like content writing, English language skills trainers, teaching, civil services, public relations, management, electronic and print media both in local and global markets. A company like Google is constantly on the lookout for students with BA English literature for their popular ad-word profile—to give just one instance of the tremendous possibilities of this subject. Also, our college is possibly the only institution which offers English Literature as an optional for boy students seeking to do BA.

Special COURSES

1. 5-Year Integrated M.Sc Chemistry: Nizam College has started a special five year integrated Chemistry program. This is the only such program started under the Jurisdiction of Osmania University. The students who qualified at +2 level are eligible for a special entrance conducted for admission into this program. It includes 2 years interdisciplinary curriculum and 3 Research Projects by the end of the 5 year course.

2. Certificate Course in Cheminformatics: University Grants Commission, New Delhi has permitted a few colleges to introduce career-oriented courses for under-graduate students and we are proud to announce that Nizam College is one of them. Chemistry, the science of materials and their transformations, exhibits a broad diversity of information, which by now encompasses an enormous body of knowledge about chemical structure, properties and reactions. Comparable efforts are needed to master the flood of information and accumulated knowledge in chemistry today. This is made possible with the advent of computers and the internet. As a sequel to this, at the turn of century, the work of the pioneers in chemistry and computer science eventually received recognition in its entirety in the form of a new inter disciplinary science: **CHEMINFORMATICS**. Even in the west this course has seen light only after 2002. **This course is exclusively offered to 30 chemistry students of Nizam College.** This course comprises units on Chemical Information (Extracting, Mining & Visualization), Chemical Structure Representation and Standards, Open Access: Molecular Databases in the Internet, “In Silico” Library Design and Analysis, Structure Activity/Property/Toxicity Relationships and Drug Design and Discovery

3. Certificate Course in Drug Designing and Synthetic Techniques Program: The field of organic chemistry and drug design is in a state of swift development and is at present undergoing major restructuring. These developments have provided new challenges and opportunities for drug research in general and for drug designing in particular. Consequently, most industrial laboratories have build up new technologies in order to meet these demands. Often the recruiting agencies and industrial groups complain about this fact. There is no program in this direction to address and

rectify this shortcoming among UG students so the department has started drug designing and synthetic techniques as an add on course to give additional skills to the existing B. Sc students.

4. Certificate Course in Chemical Analysis and Quality Assurance: This course is aimed at students pursuing under - graduate program (B.Sc / B.Sc Tech). The Chemical Analysis based on Conventional and Instrumental methods of Analysis is a science, useful in all fields. In view of its wide applications in diversified fields, it is planned to introduce as a certificate course for B.Sc Students. To maintain good laboratory data, learning “Quality Assurance” program is mandatory. Hence along with methods of Chemical Analysis, the topic ‘Quality Assurance’ is added as part of the syllabus for the course “Chemical Analysis and Quality Assurance”. Students undergo training in various classical methods of analysis as well as in instrumental methods of analysis (Colorimetry, Spectrophotometry, Potentiometry, pH-metry, Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometry, Flame Photometry, Fluorimetry etc.). With their background in the instrumental and conventional methods, the students will be given an opportunity to work with various chemical and drug industries around Hyderabad like Natco labs, Dr.Reddy labs, Divies labs, Vimta labs, CCCM, DMRL etc. These students can also join the Clinical analysis labs, environmental monitoring organizations and other industries like polymer industry, leather industry, dye manufacturing industries, cement industries etc.

5. Computer Assisted Language Learning: A well-equipped digital language lab was established in the Department of English under the CPE scheme. Using this facility short courses are being regularly conducted for both UG and PG students of the College. From this academic year students of MA English will have fixed lab hours for learning phonetics and other study skills. There is also a plan to start self-financing CALL programmes for participants both from within and outside the College.

6. Remedial Course in English: One of the UGC recommended courses conducted by the Department of English every year is a 32-hour (16 two-hour classes per day) or 4-week Remedial Course in Communication Skills in English for students coming from regional language background. The course trains students in basic communication skills such as listening, reading, writing and speaking in addition to improving the communicative competence of the students in terms of vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation. It is open to students of all faculties.

Distinctive Features of the College

1) Constituent College of Osmania University: Nizam College is a constituent college of Osmania University—that is, an off-campus college of the University. Therefore it is directly governed by the University administration. The departments and the faculty work under the guidance of the heads and chairpersons in the campus colleges. As a university college, it has greater scope for academic research and innovative programmes. The large number of teachers with doctoral degrees and post-doctoral research is a sure sign of academic excellence.

2) Academic Autonomy at UG Level: Academic autonomy at the UG level enables Nizam College to review and revise curriculum according to the needs of the stakeholders. Innovative programmes coupled with highly qualified faculty have enabled Nizam College to achieve improved standards of teaching, learning and research and also to be conferred the status of a College with Potential for Excellence.

3) CPE - College with Potential for Excellence Status: The CPE status was conferred upon the College by UGC under the X Plan which adopted an effective strategy to improve teaching, learning and research in colleges, based on the premise that higher education is one of the ways of producing talented, skilled and value-oriented human resources. The colleges selected for CPE status were evaluated on 70 different parameters. Nizam College performed commendably and was sanctioned Rs. 1 crore for further development programmes. Under this scheme the following plans were further strengthened.

- Modernization of Office, Exam - Branch and Departments
- Acquisition of Books, Maps etc.
- Fully Equipped Seminar Hall
- Central Analytical Instrumentation Centre & Chem. Informatics Lab
- Multimedia Internet Lab
- Business Lab
- Placement Centre
- Psychological Counseling and Testing Centre
- Language Lab
- The College is also conducted for CPE funding under XI Plan.

4) NAAC Accreditation: Based on curricular aspects, innovative learning, teaching and evaluation methods, research, consultancy, extension programmes, infrastructure and learning resources, student support and progression, organization and management procedures, and healthy practices Nizam College was accredited by NAAC. After NAAC accreditation, Nizam College has constituted an IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance activity. The objectives, functions, strategies and benefits of IQAC are as follows:

5) Infrastructure: The College is located in the heart of the city of Hyderabad in a sprawling 25-acre campus. There are numerous buildings housing classrooms, laboratories, computer labs, library and administrative offices. The vast area helps in creating atmosphere conducive for holistic development of the learners. Equipped with 2 Seminar Halls, Language Lab, Play Grounds, a Boxing Hall, a Canteen, Library and parking space the college has a congenial setting for learning. This academic year we have added 20 classrooms and a new hostel building.

6) Mentoring: A mentoring scheme is underway in order to make the students feel a sense of belonging as they seek guidance in academic and non-academic matters from members of the

faculty. A group of teachers from various departments form the mentoring team. In addition to student mentoring, the College also provides mentoring facilities for faculty, non-teaching and support staff.

7) Remedial Teaching for Weak Students: Sufficient care is taken by way of remedial teaching for academically weak students. The timetable for U.G. students is drafted in such a way that sufficient leisure hours are earmarked for students to take special assistance. Many departments have organised remedial coaching for Telugu Medium students, students who need special care, foreign students and students of other vernacular media—Chemistry, Political Science, English, Sanskrit, Hindi, to name a few. Sometimes special classes are arranged during holidays.

8) Evaluation of teaching by students: The College has introduced student evaluation of each course/teacher. A questionnaire is given to the student at the end of the academic year and the feedback is collated and recorded. Based on these observations, relevant discussions are held with the teacher/s concerned in order to implement suggestion given by students and enhance the quality of teaching – learning.

9) In-Service training for teachers: Teachers of the College are regularly deputed for training in special subjects. Attendance at the Orientation Course and Refresher Courses is a must for junior teachers and most of them have participated in these. Teachers have attended special training programmes for teaching vocational subjects JKC (Jawahar Knowledge Centre) offers regular programmes to train faculty of MCA department.

10) Career Guidance and Placement Centre: Under the CPE scheme, the Career Guidance and Placement Center was established in December 2004. During the X Plan CPE free training programme COPT (Career Orientation and Placement Training) was conducted for students of UG and PG in batches of about 50. About 500 students per academic year benefited from this programme. A one-day workshop on Soft Skills was conducted. Special career related programmes are also regularly organized. The Center also conducted a 6 weeks Certificate Course in Soft Skills. 10 batches of students completed the course between 2007 and 2008. Usually more than 50 companies conduct recruitment programmes in College and more than 100 students find placements in reputed companies. But economic recession has had an impact on the job scene. In spite of this about 20 companies visited the college for campus placements. During the year 2009-10 more than 120 students got selected in various companies through campus recruitments

11) ELTC: English Language Teaching Centre regularly conducts self-financing training courses in English language skills. Some of the courses conducted in the past two years are English Language Course for Foreign students of O.U and Nizam College 2008-09; Proficiency Course in English for Indian students of Nizam College. 2008-09; Basic English Course for Foreign students of Nizam College. 2008-09; Course in English Communicational Skills for Students, Professionals and others, January 2009. (2 batches); Course on Writing Skills, April 2009, Course in Spoken and Written English for Students, Professionals and others, May - June 2009; Course in Spoken and Written English for Students, Professionals and others, June 2009; Course in Spoken and Written English for Students, Professionals and others, Sept-Oct 2009. The centre proposes to conduct Teacher Training Courses for the school and college teachers in the state.

12) CEDM (Center for Educational Development of Minorities) The College has a center for Educational Development of Minorities which runs many courses: EMCET, DIETCET, DSC, ICET, EDCET, Competitive Exams like civils, Group I and II are offered and the participants are numerous. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Prof. Tirupati Rao participated in the event gave his blessings & motivated the participants. In the 2009 Civil Services examinations, one of our participant

Jeelani got the 502nd rank. In 2010 3 students qualified NET, 7 got selected in Group I and 15 have appeared for Civil Service interviews (results awaited).

13) NCC Activities: Nizam College has a company of over 100 cadets and all the activities are under the control of a part-time NCC Officer. Over 75% of our cadets pass out with B & C Certificates. They actively participate in various camps like Army Attachment Camp, CACT Camp, National Mountaineering Camp, National Integration Camp, etc. Participation of NCC cadets of Nizam College at the Annual Republic Day Parade in New Delhi is a regular feature. In the Golden Jubilee Republic Day Parade the N.C.C contingent of Andhra Pradesh which won the Prime Ministers Medal had three of our NCC cadets as participants. This year too our cadets have won prizes in cultural activities in NCC camps in various parts of the country. Their involvement in NCC and the laurels won by them help the cadets in securing seats for higher education under the NCC quota. A sense of discipline is inculcated in students who enroll as NCC cadets.

14) Games & Sports: Numerous games and sports activities are organized by the Department of Physical Education. The vast campus of the College is equipped with grounds for Cricket, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Shuttle, Hockey, Kabbadi, Foot Ball, Korf Ball and rooms for indoor games like Table Tennis, Chess, etc. This is the only college in the twin cities to have such facility other than the O.U. Campus. A Multi-Station gymnasium costing Rs.1 lakh has been installed in the College recently. The Department conducts various events both at the College and Inter-college level. Our students have participated in the Inter-Collegiate Tournaments in some of the above events in addition to swimming and athletics. The performance of the teams is commendable and our teams have been winners in Swimming, Cricket, Table Tennis and Athletics. Our students have participated in many games at Junior Nationals, Inter-University and Junior State level. 16 students represented O.U, in the Inter University Tournaments. During the academic year 2008-09, 4 students of the College represented Hyderabad Cricket Association in State, National and Ranji Cricket; our Foot ball team won Satyam Trophy (ICT), O.U, for the second consecutive year. Mr. Nizam College (2009), bagged the Bronze medal in ICT best physic competition. T.Vijay Kanth, a final year student (Theatre Arts) drove a scooter blindfold, from 1-1-09 to 17-1-09. He covered 4085 km encompassing 23 districts. He broke the earlier record which was for 3186 km. His feat is being considered for inclusion into the Limca Book of Records and the Guinness Book of World Records.

15) Extra Curricular Activities & Extension Works: Students constitute the core of an educational institution and the overall development of their personality should be the prime motive of educational institutions. Having realized this basic need, Nizam College has been providing various opportunities to its students for a total and meaningful personality development. The students' affairs are guided by a Students Welfare Officer appointed by the Principal. One of the major activities is the annual cultural meet, viz., "*EXPRESSIONS*." It provides an opportunity to our students to organise various literary and cultural events and to interact with hundreds of students from all the other colleges in the city. Students are also sponsored by the College to participate in various cultural and literary events at the Inter-College and Inter-University level both within and outside the State. Our students have started various Clubs Science Club, Eco – Awareness, Book Review Club, Population Club, Social Productivity Club, Crafts Club, General Knowledge Club, Learners' Club, Thought Club, Creative Writing Club, Computer and Creativity Club, Laughter Club, Music Club. The *Discussion Forum* holds debates on current issues, the *Ray-Orion Club* organizes cultural and literary activities, the Eco Club creates environmental awareness, the *Science Club* keeps up with the innovations in the field of science and so on. A *Women's Cell* constituted for gender sensitization enables students to participate in awareness programmes. Girl students are given necessary support for organising seminars or discussions on the role and problems of women in the developmental process. Educational tours and programmes are encouraged. The year highlighted these activities during the year-long 120-years Celebration from February to December.

16) NSS Activities: The enrolment in the National Service Scheme is quite high and over 150 candidates are on rolls. NSS activities are held under the direction of the NSS Programme Officer who is appointed by the NSS Coordinator, Osmania University, on the Principal's recommendation. NSS volunteers have been actively participating in several programmes like the Green Run, Tree Plantation programmes organised by the MCH, National Integration Communal Harmony Seminar, *Sadbhavana* Run conducted by the Directorate of Youth Services, Govt. of A.P. They also organised a very successful blood donation camp in the College.

17) Multimedia Lab: Under the CPE Scheme the College has established a Multimedia Lab during the academic year 2004-2005. This lab enables the teachers to prepare and present lessons in multimedia format. Self-Financing short-term courses are planned for teachers and students. This enhances the quality of teaching-learning and benefits numerous students. Workshops are held to train teachers in the preparation of lessons in multimedia format.

18) Language Lab: A language lab with software for language learning skills is available. This lab enables Computer Aided Language Learning and Computer Based Testing.

19) Psychological Testing and Counseling Cell: This Cell offers personal counseling as well as psychological testing for school and college students related to intelligence, personality, family dynamics, early identification of MR, LD and other behavioral problems.

20) Interaction with Parents: The College tries to maintain an interactive relationship with the parents / guardians of the students on a regular basis. We, therefore, request the parents/guardians of our students to devote some time to check the progress of their children / wards. **We also request the parents to furnish their current contact details and feel free to contact us as often as necessary.** An atmosphere where our students can express themselves freely and overcome inhibitions is thus created. Formal meets with parents to facilitate a tripartite interaction is a regular feature.

21) Alumni Association: The Alumni Association of the college meets regularly. Some activities taken up by the alumni are: interaction with the present students, extension lectures in their respective fields of expertise, cultural activities and aid to improve infrastructural facilities. Some renowned alumni participated in the recent 120-years celebrations and gave valuable advice. A volume of alumni reminiscences *Kaliedoscope* was published to mark the occasion. 22) Academic Awards: A Gold Medal in Economics has been instituted to be awarded to the topper in BA (English Medium, EPP). An Annual Endowment Lecture in Economics has also been initiated. An alumna Sri M.A. Krishnamurthy has instituted a prize for the students scoring highest marks in Mathematics at the undergraduate level. Others are also encouraged to institute similar academic awards/medals to encourage students in their march towards excellence.

23) Library & Study Center: The College has a well-equipped main library with about 1, 07,577 books and 78 journals which include text and reference books and research journals. The library functions on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. The main library is open on holidays during examinations to facilitate students preparing for the exams. The Library is headed by a Librarian and assisted by 13 personnel. Books on all the subjects of general interest are available here. Besides the main library, some of the post-graduate and undergraduate departments have their own Seminar Libraries. Recently a special wing of library has been established—exclusively for the

professional courses like BCA, M.Sc(IS), MBA and MCA. A separate “Study Centre” caters to the needs of students belonging to various colleges in the twin cities and also to those appearing privately for university examinations. The Centre functions from 12.00 noon to 6.00 p.m. on all days of the week except Thursdays. The Centre has more than 4000 text and reference books which include books from all disciplines. Digitalisation of the library has been completed this year.

24) Hostel: The College has a hostel at a furlong’s distance from the academic campus and has been catering to about 500 boarders. It is managed by the General Warden, a Mess Warden and Vice Principal (Hostels). On the recommendations of the Principal, Osmania University appoints these officers. The University also has hostels in the O.U campus for the benefit of M.A & M.Com students of Nizam College. **The College has no hostel accommodate for girls and for boys admitted in UG first year. Accommodation is available for II and III year UG boys and PG (M.Sc.) boys. PG girls have hostel accommodation at OU Campus Ladies Hostel.**

25) Health Center: The College has a Health Center with a full-time doctor looking after the needs of both staff and students. The Health Center is well-equipped for first-aid and outpatient consultancy. The Center also serves the needs of hostel boarders. It also helps in organising health camps on the campus.

26) Grievance Redressal Cell: Any student who has a complaint can register it and ask for help. Drop your suggestions/complaints into drop-boxes provided in all blocks of the college. Senior professors who form part of the GR Cell will advice and provide solutions to the aggrieved. They also consider issues like facilities in college, staff and student related matters, theft and discipline related matters.

27) Add-on & Skill-oriented Courses: UGC has recognised the need for value-added courses at the UG level. With this objective in view, Nizam College has designed Certificate and Diploma courses approved and sanctioned by the UGC. These courses are offered without affecting the regular classes. Many students find these courses interesting and valuable. The Certificate courses entail coursework of 300 hours limited to one semester while the Diploma courses have 600 hours covering two semesters.

28) M.Sc Chemistry (Pharmaco Informatics) is started for the first time in India, at Nizam College during the year 2009-10. This is part funded by UGC under inter disciplinary innovative program. It has all the best features of Pharma programs, Organic Chemistry and The Chem Informatics and Computer aided drug designing curriculum being included.

RAGGING, according to UGC Regulations means: “any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

ANNEXURE – I

Rules of Admission in Accordance with the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulations of Admission) Order, 1974 – With Amendments, 1975 & 1976

I. Admission to 85% of the available seats in every course of study profiled by Osmania University shall be reserved in favor of Local Area in respect of the Osmania University.

‘A’ Local Area:

The part of state comprising the districts of Adilabad, Hyderabad, (including the twin cities) Karimnagar, Khammam, Mahaboobnagar, Medak, Nalgonda, Nizamabad, Ranga Reddy and Warangal shall be regarded as the local area for the purpose of admission to the Osmania University and to any other educational institution (other than, State-wide University or State-wide Educational institution which is subject to the control of the State Government and is situated in that part). [Privately managed educational institutions (including private colleges) are not covered by the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh Educational institutions regulation of admission order, 1974].

‘B’ Local Candidate:

1. A candidate for admission to any course of study shall be regarded as a Local candidate in relation to local area.
 - i. If he/she studied in an educational Institution or educational Institutions in such local area for period of not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the Academic Year in which he / she appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination or
 - ii. Where, during, the whole or any part of the four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in any educational institution if he has not studied in any educational institution if he has resided in that local area or for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared.
2. A candidate for admission to any course of study who is not regarded as a local candidate under sub para (1) in relation to any local area.
 - a. If he/she studied in an educational institution in the State for a period of not less than seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination be regarded as a local candidate in relation to
 - i. Such local area where he has studied for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years, or
 - ii. Where the periods of his study in two or more local areas are, equal, such local area where he has studied last in such equal periods, or
 - b. If during the whole or any of the seven consecutive academic year in which he appeared, or as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in the educational institutions in any local area, but has resided in the state during the whole of the said period of seven years, be regarded as local candidate in relation to:

- i. Such local area where he has studied out of the said period of seven years, or
 - ii. Where the periods of his study in two or more local areas are equal such local area where he has studied last in such equal periods.
- II. The remaining 15% of the available seats left unreserved in terms of the presidential order shall be made available to:
 - a) All candidates who have studied in a recognized educational institution or institutions in the State for a period or not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which they appeared, as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination, or where during the whole or any part of such four consecutive academic years, not studied in any educational institution if they have resided in the State for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination.
 - b) Candidates who have resided in the state for a total period of ten years excluding periods of study outside the state, or either of whose parents have resided in the State for a total period of ten years excluding the periods of employment outside the State.
 - c) Candidates who are children of parents who are in the employment of this State or Central Government / Public sector corporation Local Bodies, Universities and other similar quasi / public institutions within the State.
 - d) Candidates who are spouses of those in the employment of this State or Central Government, Public Sector Corporations, Local Bodies, Universities and Educational Institutions recognized by the Government, a University or other competent authority and similar other competent authority and similar other quasi-Government Institution within the State.
 - e) Candidate who are employees in the State, Central Government Undertaking, Public Sector Corporations, Local Bodies Universities and other similar quasi-public institutions within the State.
